

**Study and Examination Regulations for
B.A. International Management
at Deggendorf Institute of Technology**

dated 23 July 2025

Based on Art. 9, 80 para. 1, 84 para. 2(1) of the Bavarian Higher Education Innovation Act (BayHIG) of 5 August 2022 (GVBl. p. 414, BayRS 2210-1-3-WK), last amended by Section 3 of the Act dated 23 June 2023 (GVBl. p. 251) and by Section 2 of the Act of 24 July 2023 (GVBl. p. 455), Deggendorf Institute of Technology enacts the following by-laws:

**Section 1
Aim of the degree programme**

The aim of this programme is to train internationally oriented business economists who can address business-related issues on the basis of scientific findings. Specifically, students will

- Acquire comprehensive specialist knowledge which will enable them to take on management tasks in internationally oriented companies,
- develop social skills that will allow them to act competently in a cross-cultural environment and
- build methodological skills that will enable them to navigate confidently the complex and dynamic environment of a global economy.

An interdisciplinary approach ensures that the outlined qualification goals are achieved. Sound language skills form the basis of the approach. The interactive teaching of business management expertise with an international focus centres on a general management perspective. Behaviour-oriented training in cross-cultural skills is based on findings drawn from various social science disciplines. Methodological competences include empirical social research tools, knowledge of business informatics and international project management methodology.

**Section 2
Structure of the programme, standard period of study**

- (1) The standard period of study is seven semesters, six of which are theory-based and one is practical. One theory-based semester is to be completed at a university abroad (semester abroad).

The order in which the semester abroad and the practical semester are completed is not specified. The semester abroad can be completed in either the fourth or fifth semester. The same applies to the internship semester.

- (2) A total of 210 ECTS credits must be attained.

Section 3 Proof of language proficiency

If English is not the native language, proof of B2 level English language skills as defined under the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages has to be provided with the application.

Foreign language: As part of the Foreign Language module, students have to complete at least one language at level A1 (but not English). International students (who have not previously completed B2 level) must take German. Native German speakers and international students (with a completed and certified German B2 level) can select a language of their choice.

Regarding the proof, the regulations set out in Section 3 of the general examination regulations for additional qualification in foreign languages and compulsory elective subjects of a general academic nature (AWP) of Deggendorf Institute of Technology shall apply as amended.

Section 4 Modules and courses

- (1) The degree programme comprises modules that may consist of thematically-related courses. Each module is assigned ECTS credits which reflect the time of study required of the students.
- (2) The compulsory and elective modules, the lectures, their number of hours, the type of courses, the examinations and the ECTS credits are specified in the Appendix to these by-laws. The regulations of subject-specific compulsory elective modules and compulsory elective subjects of a general academic nature are supplemented by the curriculum.
- (3) All modules comprise compulsory modules, compulsory elective modules or optional modules:
 1. Compulsory modules are those modules held during the degree programme which are binding for all students.
 2. Compulsory elective modules are alternative modules offered individually or in groups. Students must select certain modules from these in accordance with these study and examination regulations. The selected modules will be treated as compulsory modules.
 3. Optional modules are modules that are not necessarily required in order to achieve the study objective. They may be additionally selected from the courses offered by the Institute.

There is no guarantee that the scheduled specialisations, compulsory elective modules and optional modules will actually be offered. Likewise, no rights or entitlement exist to the accompanying courses of instruction taking place in the event of insufficient student numbers.

Section 5 Curriculum

The responsible faculty, currently the Faculty of Applied Economics (School of Management) prepares a curriculum for the purpose of securing the teaching provision and to provide information to students. This shows the course of studies in detail. The curriculum is approved by the Faculty Council and announced within the university before the semester starts. Changes or new regulations, if any, must be announced at the latest at the beginning of the lecture period of the semester in which these changes are to be implemented for the first time. In particular, the curriculum contains regulations and information regarding:

1. the time allocated for the weekly hours per semester, the time allocated per module and semester, including the attainable ECTS credits;
2. the names of the compulsory and compulsory elective modules as well as their respective number of weekly hours per semester;
3. the subject-related compulsory elective modules, including the number of hours involved;
4. the form of instruction used in each individual module, provided that this has not been conclusively specified in Appendix 1;
5. the type of examination and its duration,
6. the lectures accompanying the internship during the practical semester as well as their form of instruction and organisation

Section 6 Basic Modules

Study and examination achievements up to a scope of 60 ECTS credits, which were acquired in a similarly named or related bachelor's degree programme at a state or state-recognised university of applied sciences in Bavaria in basic modules of the degree programme, shall be credited upon application without further examination to the basic modules in a bachelor's degree programme at the admitting university. The basic modules of this degree programme are marked with an * in the curriculum (Appendix 1).

Section 7 Minimum ECTS score requirement (GOP)

By the end of the second semester, students must have taken examinations in the following modules for the first time:

Business Mathematics and Data Analytics
Statistics
Principles of Accounting
Cost Accounting

for the first time.

Past this deadline, the missing examination performance in any above-mentioned basics and orientation examination not yet taken will be rated "failed".

Section 8

Admission to the internship semester and the study specialisation

- (1) Admission to the internship semester, the study period abroad and further studies may only occur once at least 60 ECTS credits have been obtained from modules IM-01 to IM-21.
- (2) Students who have not earned at least 60 ECTS credits before beginning their internship semester or study period abroad are required to consult with their academic advisor.
- (3) As prerequisites for taking modules IM-24 to IM-34, students must have passed their internship semester and attained at least 75 ECTS credits from modules IM-01 to IM-21.

Section 9

Internship semester

- (1) The internship semester comprises a minimum of 20 but no more than 24 weeks, of which two are devoted to the courses accompanying the internships (PLVs).
- (2) If the training objective is not affected, then - by way of exception - students need not make up for interruptions in practical work if they are not responsible for these interruptions (e.g. shutdown, illness) and if the total number of days lost due to the interruption is not more than five working days. In the case of a reserve duty training exercise, the make-up period shall be waived if it does not last more than ten working days. Students must prove that they are not responsible for the interruption. If the interruptions extend beyond five and ten working days respectively, students must make up for the total number of lost days. Work completed as overtime can offset interruptions.

Section 10

Semester abroad

- (1) During the semester abroad, students must earn 30 ECTS credits, with at least 20 of which being attained in business administration, economics, business informatics and foreign language modules. Modules that essentially correspond to the compulsory modules or the compulsory elective modules of the degree programme at Deggendorf Institute of Technology may not be selected.
- (2) Studies and examinations occurring during the semester abroad are governed by the relevant regulations of the foreign university at which the studies are completed.
- (3) Before starting their semester abroad, students must conclude a learning agreement with Deggendorf Institute of Technology and the foreign university to ensure that the credits earned abroad will be recognised.

- (4) Students who have earned or been awarded fewer than 30 ECTS credits must take additional compulsory elective courses of a subject-specific nature at Deggendorf Institute of Technology to make up the difference between the credits earned during their semester abroad and the 30 ECTS credits required.
- (5) The semester representative for the degree programme in question can be contacted at any time for advice.

Section 11

Assessment of examination performance; overall examination grade

- (1) ECTS credits are awarded for each successfully passed examination. The number of attainable credits per exam is shown in the Appendix.
- (2) A student's overall examination grade is calculated using a weighted arithmetic average of their individual grades. The weighting of an individual grade is equal to the number of ECTS credits assigned to the course for which the grade was awarded.
- (3) In addition to the overall grade assigned as per para. 2, a relative grade is awarded based on the numerical value attained, in keeping with the ECTS User Guide, as per the provisions of Section 8(6) General Examination Regulations of Deggendorf Institute of Technology.
- (4) Should an end-of-module examination comprise multiple module component examinations, a grade of "nicht ausreichend" ("insufficient") awarded in one module component examination may not be offset by a higher grade in another.

Section 12

Bachelor's Thesis

- (1) When writing their bachelor's thesis, students will be required to demonstrate their ability to apply unassisted the knowledge and skills they have acquired in the course of their studies to complex tasks.
- (2) Students having acquired at least 120 ECTS credits are eligible to register for their bachelor's thesis.
- (3) The completion time for the bachelor's thesis is three months.

Section 13

Certificate

On passing the bachelor's examination, a corresponding certificate is issued in line with the sample shown in the appendix to the General Examination Regulations of Deggendorf Institute of Technology.

Section 14
Academic degree and diploma supplement

- (1) Based on the successful completion of the bachelor's examination, the academic degree "Bachelor of Arts", abbreviated as: "B.A."
- (2) A certificate granting the academic degree shall be issued in accordance with the respective template in the Appendix to the General Examination Regulations of Deggendorf Institute of Technology.
- (3) A diploma supplement, which describes in particular the essential course content underlying the degree, the course of studies and the qualification obtained with the degree, is enclosed with the certificate in two languages.

Section 15
Entry into force (and transitional provisions - if any)

These Study and Examination Regulations enter into force on 01 October 2025. They shall apply to all students commencing their studies in the winter semester 2025/2026 or later.
